

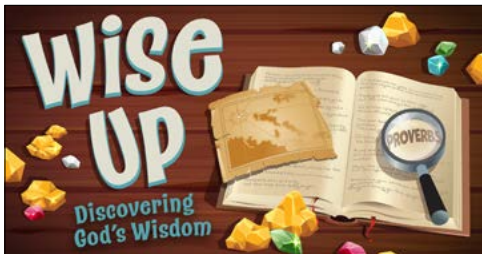
## In God's Big Story

### Sound Scavenger Hunt

Plan a walk through your neighborhood, a park, or the mall. Before you go, give your kids a list of sounds to find (dogs barking, car horn, leaves rustling, etc.). Feel free to make the list together! Then go for a walk. See how many sounds you can find.

**What did we have to do to find our sounds? We had to listen carefully! In the same way, we must listen carefully to God's wisdom.** You could choose to end by reading Proverbs 8:1–11 together.

## LIFE CONNECTION

### What Does Wisdom Say?

Share the following open-ended scenarios with your family, discuss your thoughts, and then look up and read the passage in Proverbs together. Be sure to explain or define any unfamiliar words in the verses.

**Scenario 1: Clara thinks she is the best player on her team. She wants to make sure her coach and the other players know it. What should she do?**

After talking about this scenario, read Proverbs 11:2. Discuss the verse and how it relates to Clara's situation.

**Scenario 2: Joel's mom asks if he has finished his homework. The rule is he can't play outside until it's done. It's getting dark, so Joel thinks about telling his mom the work is all done, even though it isn't. After all, he can finish it later. What should he do?**

After talking about this scenario, read Proverbs 10:9 and 12:22. Discuss the verses and how they relate to Joel's situation.
